# **Guide to Registering for Spring 2011**

# **Registration Dates for Juniors:**

Tuesday, November 9, 2010 to Wednesday, November 10, 2010	Day Students who have earned 89 credits & above
Thursday, November 11, 2010:	Day Students who have earned 65 credits & above
Friday, November 12, 2010 to Sunday, November 14, 2010:	Day Students who have earned 59 credits & above
Monday, November 15, 2010:	Day Students who have earned 40 credits & above

- Be sure to have any holds on your account cleared before your registration date.

# Liberal Arts Core Classes:

Please remember: you <u>cannot</u> satisfy any of your Liberal Arts Core classes with a Liberal Studies (FCLS) course. So make sure you pick a course that meets during the day because any liberal arts class that meets once a week in the evening (or during the weekend) is actually an FCLS course.

Your Fine Arts Requirement is satisfied by one of the following:

- Art History (under Art History)
- Music History Intro (under Music History)
- Urbanism (under Visual Arts)
- Invitation to Theatre (under Theatre)

#### Your Freshman History/West Enlightenment Requirement is satisfied by:

• HIST 1000 - Understanding Historical Change: Modern Europe

Your **Sophomore History Requirement** is satisfied by any History course between HIST 1100 and HIST 1700, as well as AFAM 1100, such as:

- Understanding Historical Change: American History
- Understanding Historical Change: Ancient Rome
- Understanding Historical Change: Medieval History

- Understanding Historical Change: Latin American History (Please note: this also fulfills your Globalism requirement)
- Understanding Historical Change: East Asian History (Please note: this also fulfills your Globalism requirement)
- Understanding Historical Change: Mid-East History (Please note: this also fulfills your Globalism requirement)
- Understanding Historical Change: Africa (which is under African & African American Studies) (Please note: this also fulfills your Globalism requirement)

Your **Sophomore Literature Requirement** is now satisfied by any English Course with the "Advanced Literature Core Attribute" (but NOT "Eloquentia Perfecta 3" as well, because those are for FCRH students only). So, your choices would be:

- MEDIEVAL LITERATURE
- ROCK, RAP & POETIC TRADITION
- ROMANTICISM & REVOLUTION
- Major American Authors
- AMERICAN LITERATURE 1890-1929
- LITERATURE OF THE WEST
- Gothic Legacies

Your **Sophomore Theology Requirement** will be satisfied by any Theology course with the "Sacred Texts & Trad core" attribute, such as:

- Intro to Old Testament
- The Prophets
- Intro to New Testament
- The Four Gospels
- The Parables of Jesus
- Life and Letters of Paul
- Early Christian Writings
- Byzantine Christianity
- Church in Controversy
- Great Christian Hymns
- Classic Buddhist Texts (Please note: this course also fulfills your Globalism requirement)

# Your Natural Science Requirement will be satisfied by the following:

- Intro to Physical Anthropology (under Anthropology)
- Ecology: A Human Approach (under Biology)
- Foundations of Biology (under Biology)

- The Chemistry of Art (under Chemistry)
- Chemistry of the Environment (under Chemistry)
- Introduction to Astronomy (under Physics)
- Enviornmental Physics (under Physics)
- Biopsychology (under Psychology)
  - Please note, if you wish to minor in Psychology, you need to take Foundations of Psychology. However, because that course is not open to GSB students, you'll need to contact the Psychology Dept in order to get in: Dealy 345

If you're restricted from a liberal arts course, you're welcome to stop by and talk to me about it, but it will probably be more efficient to just go to the chair or associate chair of that particular department to see if you can get in. However, just so you know, if a class is closed, there's probably a reason, so, consequently, they're probably not going to let you in.

#### **Business Core courses:**

- Business Policy is for Seniors only.
- Only register for Principles of Managerial Accounting if you've completed (or are currently in) Principles of Financial Accounting.
- Only register for Statistical Decision Making (under CBA Management) if you've completed (or are currently in) Statistics I (under Economics).
- Only register for Operations & Production Management (under CBA Management) if you've completed (or are currently in) Statistical Decision Making.
- Only register for Financial Management (under CBA Finance) if you've completed (or are currently in) Principles of Financial Accounting
- I strongly suggest you only register for Marketing Principles (under CBA Marketing) if you've completed (or are currently in) Principles of Financial Accounting

# **Business Majors**

#### **Public Accounting Students**

• If you're an Accounting major, please remember you need to take Intermediate Financial Accounting 2 next semester (as long as you're taking Intermediate Financial Accounting 1 this

semester). It's a pre-requisite for most of the other Accounting classes (such as Assurance & Auditing, Advanced Assurance & Auditing, and Advanced Concepts), which you'll be unable to take until you finish Intr. Fin. Acct. 2.

- If you haven't taken Intermediate 1 yet, but still want to pursue the Accounting major, then register for part 1 next semester (as long as you've completed ACBU 2222 and 2223) along with Individual & Business Taxation.
- If you're looking to fulfill other Accounting classes for your major in addition to Intermediate 2, I recommend fulfilling one of your business electives (which can be satisfied by any business course) and/or fulfilling one of your accounting electives, which can be satisfied with:
  - ST: Accounting Information Systems
  - Global Financial Statement Analysis
  - Corporate & Partnership Taxation
  - > Ethics in Financial Reporting & Accounting (Please note: Business Ethics is a Pre-Req for this course)
- I recommend leaving Commercial Transaction Law until your senior year because much of the material there actually shows up on the CPA exam, so it's better to take it as close to the exam as possible. If you do wind up taking it, though, be sure to keep your notes.

# **Entrepreneurship Students**

- If you're pursuing an Entrepreneurship concentration, you should register for Money and the Meaning of Life (under CBA Marketing) if you haven't already done so.
- All Entrepreneurship students have to take Venture Practicum 1 and 2. However, if you haven't taken 1 yet, don't try to register for 2 because they're sequential. Part 1 will be offered in the Fall.
- For the Spring, you can satisfy the Entrepreneurship elective with: Innovation & the Entrepreneurial Mindset (under Management)

# **Finance Students**

- If you're pursuing a Finance major or concentration, please remember that you need to complete Financial Management before going on to any upper-level Finance courses.
- If you still have to take Financial Management next semester but you want another class to go towards your major, then take any 3000 level Economics course, as you're allowed up to 3 of those for your Finance/Econ electives.
- If you're in or have already completed Financial Management, and you're wondering what courses to take next, I recommend taking Investments & Security Analysis and/ Corporate Financial Policy.
- If you're interested in Portfolio Management or International Investments, please remember that Investments & Security Analysis is the prerequisite for those courses.
- If you're in the Student Managed Investment Fund (SMIF), do not register for International Investments, as the second semester of SMIF satisfies that requirement.
- Please be aware that ACBU 3436 Accounting for Finance Majors is now titled ACBU 3436 Global Financial Statement Analysis.

- This semester we will be offering Quantitative Portfolio Management, which is the same as regular Portfolio Management, but with a more rigorous quantitative aspect. This course is by permission only, so if you're interested, let me know. Please note, though, that because of the overlap, you cannot take both Portfolio Management and Quantitative Portfolio Management.
- In general, I don't recommend taking any 4000 level Finance courses until you've completed a few 3000 level courses. So you might be better off leaving such classes (e.g. Financial Modeling, Hedge Fund, or Derivatives) until senior year if you're considering any of them.

#### **Information Systems Students**

- Take Database Systems or Object Based Programming before you take Telecommunications.
- Take Database Systems and Object Based Programming before you take Systems Analysis.
- Don't try to take Systems Design until you complete Systems Analysis.
- Information Systems Management is for seniors only.

#### **Marketing Students**

- If you're pursuing either the Marketing major or concentration, I recommend taking Marketing Research and/or Consumer Behavior if you haven't done so already.
- Don't register for Advertising under Communication & Media studies or Consumer Behavior under Psychology if you intend to major in Marketing.
- Marketing Strategy is for Seniors only.

# Electives

- **Business electives** are satisfied by any business course offered by GSB. So, as long as you've satisfied any required pre-requisites, you can take just about any Business course you like for this elective, whether its Accounting, Finance, Management, etc.
- Liberal Arts electives are satisfied by any class taught by FCRH or FCLS evening courses (but NOT weekend courses). Thus, as long as you've satisfied any required pre-requisites, you can take just about any liberal arts class, whether its Anthropology, Economics, English, Italian, Math, Painting, a Science, etc.

# **Globalism Requirement:**

• As I'm sure you're aware, you also have a Globalism requirement to complete with one of your 40 courses. If you didn't already do so with one of your Liberal Arts Cores or Electives, here are some business courses that you can use within your major or concentration:

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Under CBA Accounting Advanced Assurance and Auditing Ethics in Financial Reporting & Accounting

Under Economics World Poverty

Under CBA Finance International Investments

Under CBA Management Negotiating Globally

Under CBA Marketing International Marketing Marketing in the Pacific Rim
