 - Other course selections should be discussed with me *prior* to registration









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Identifying Spring 2012 Classes Step 4: Review available sections

- Select: Indicates if Class is available
 - C=closed
 - RC=reserve closed
 - Note: Class may not say it is NR closed, but the spaces that NR are left may not be able to be NR used by Gabelli students (for NR example, held for FCRH NR students) NR
 - HAVE BACK-UPS
- CRN:
 - Code you will need to register for ٠ class
 - Write down all CRNs of courses • you would be willing to take; it is unlikely you will get your first choice
- Sec: check to make sure it starts with an "R"
 - -Cannot take "L" or "E" or "C" •
 - LC-only Foreign Language ٠ Japanese exception for "L"







Having Trouble?

- May be a FCRH only course for their core curriculum (Eloquentia Perfecta)
- Reserve Closed: Looks open, but may have spots reserved for FCRH students
- May not be eligible due to other reasons (pre-requisites, etc.)
- May have reached your credit limit: **17**
 - If you think you will be registering for more than 17 credits, you must see me PRIOR to registration
- Don't wait register for a different course/section better to register and drop than not register at all



- **PF/P=**satisfactory work, no grade points.
- **PF/F=**failure, but not included in grade point computation.
- **WF** = failure for withdrawing from a course after the last day for dropping courses without academic penalty. It is the equivalent of an F.
- **S/U=**satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis. It is not included in grade point computation.
- **INC=**temporary grade given when a course requirement, other than the final exam, has not been met.
- **ABS** =temporary grade granted by the instructor for absence from the final examination, due to extenuating circumstances such as illness or death in the family.
- **NGR=**no grade reported by the instructor.
- **W**=withdrawal from a course after add/drop without academic penalty.

Definition of Terms

•Attempted Hours: The number of credits assigned to each course for which the student registered.

•Earned Hours: The actual number of credits earned in each course; cumulatively reflects the number of credits successfully completed to date, meaning all classes already passed at Fordham plus any IB/AP/transfer credits awarded, including Pass/Fail courses; does not include courses in which you are currently enrolled.

•Quality Points: The numerical value of the earned grade in each course multiplied by the number of credits assigned for each course that was attempted for a regular grade (quality hours).

•Grade point average: is a weighted average used to indicate to the student and to the faculty the academic progress of each student. Since each course is added to the accumulated average of all courses pursued, it is a cumulative index and is computed by dividing the quality points by the quality hours.

•A passing grade is a D or better.

•"WF", or withdrawal failure, is the numerical equivalent of an F and is counted towards GPA hours.

•Courses taken Pass/Fail are not counted towards GPA hours, and are not included in the GPA.



Midterm Grade Progress Report

- How did you do?
 - If your midterm results were strong, congratulations!
 - Be proud, but don't relax too much between now and Finals and lose your advantage.
 - If your midterm results were moderate, good job.
 - Try to identify areas of slight improvement.
 - If your midterm results were poor, reflect on improvement.
 - What can you do to strengthen your grade?
 - Have you visited Professor Office Hours?
 - Have you visited the Help rooms for Math, Economics, Writing, etc., or gotten a tutor?
 - If your midterm results are failing, strategize.
 - Should you be dropping a class to allow more time for other courses?
 - Can you recover your grade?
 - What is your plan to succeed? Did you create a plan with your professor?

•Standards applied at the end of each semester, not for Midterm Progress Reports.

•Academic Probation

•Academic probation is a serious warning that a student must improve his/her academic performance.

•May continue to study at Fordham & be awarded financial aid.

•Not automatically acquired by the student but must be granted by the dean; restricted to two consecutive semesters. •Subject to dismissal if judged not to be making satisfactory progress.

•May be prohibited from participating in extracurricular activities, being an RA, or representing the University in intervarsity athletic competition.

•Academic Suspension

•In addition to GPA, a student who has three failures in any semester may be subject to suspension or dismissal.

• Enforced termination of formal studies; only granted once in career for minimum of 2 semesters.

•If after a period of suspension a student wished to continue his/her studies in the Gabelli School, he/she must formally apply for readmission. Need a 2.750 GPA at an approved baccalaureate institution.

•Academic Dismissal

• Once dismissed, may no longer take courses.
