#### Fall 2013 Courses

- Most courses are part of the Integrated Business Core Curriculum.
- Cohort Style: You will be with the same group of students in all of your classes; the classes are offered in a group/set.
- All but ONE of the classes you will be taking are part of the Cohort. You will get to choose ONE class from a list of my recommendations.
- The group of students in your class will be broken into teams; you will work with your team on your Integrated Project.
  - Team of 4-5 students.
  - Team serves as a consulting firm presenting analysis and recommendations to the top management team of a Fortune 500 company!

#### Fall 2013 Courses

- Integrated Project Class: 1 credit, meets the full Fall 2013 semester. You will work in your team on the Integrated Project, incorporating coursework from all Fall 2013 courses.
- Full semester classes (3 or 4 credits): Principles of Financial Accounting (ACBU 2222), Marketing Principles (MKBU 3225), and the class of your choice.
- Half classes (1.5 credits): Business Communications (CMBU 2664), Principles of Management (MGBU 3222), Strategy (MGBU 4440), and Information Systems (INSY 2299). Take other half of class either Fall junior or Fall senior year.
  - These 1.5 credit classes will each be offered 1 day each week for the entire semester.
  - Half of your cohort will be in one Business Communications class, the other half will be in a different Business
     Communications class.
- You ALL must take ALL of these courses, no exceptions.
- EACH GROUP/SET OF CLASSES WILL HAVE ONE OF EACH OF THE ABOVE CLASSES.

#### Example of Group/Set

Register ONLY for this 1 CRN; you will automatically be registered for all of the others in this set/group

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There are TWO Business Communications classes listed; you will only take ONE of them. You will be placed in one of the two based on your IP team.

•You will register for the CRN for the Integrated Project.

- •At a later time, WE will register you for the other classes listed in this set and will assign you to a Integrated Project Team.
- •We will choose ONE of the Business Communications sections for you based upon the team to which you have been assigned.
- •You will register for ONE class of your choice; it will be YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to ensure it doesn't conflict with the rest of the classes in your cohort, the system won't show a time conflict.

#### Registration for Fall 2013

- Different from Spring 2013; for Fall 2013, you will register yourself for TWO classes.
  - ONE class will be your cohort IP. This class will indicate the group/set of classes you want and into
    which you will be placed. By picking this one class, you are picking all of the other cohort classes, since
    they are offered as a group/set.
    - If the group/set/cohort of classes that you want is full, you must pick another one for which you will register; like prior registration, when a class is full, you need to find another section. **Keep trying until you get into an INTEGRATED PROJECT class.**
    - Do NOT register for more than one cohort. If you do, we will select one at random to determine your cohort.
    - There will likely be 14 cohorts; specific information (dates/times) will be emailed to you, likely after Spring Break.
    - Please note: Professors associated with courses are **SUBJECT TO CHANGE until the semester begins.**
    - You will NOT be able to DROP/ADD. Once you are in a cohort, no changes will be permitted. Absolutely no drop/add will be allowed after classes start.
    - After you register for the Integrated Project, it will look like you are only registered for one 1-credit course. Within a few months, we will do the rest and you will automatically be registered for your other courses that are part of the group/set EXCEPT for Business Communications.
      - You will notice that each SET/GROUP has TWO BUSINESS COMMUNICATIONS (CMBU 2664) TIME OPTIONS.
        - » You will be placed in ONE of these times after registration. You will not pick this time-it will be picked for you.
        - » You will likely be registered for this class sometime in late August. This is because your assignment to this class is directly tied to your team assignment. Teams cannot be finalized until late summer, so neither can Bus Comm.
  - The OTHER class should be from the list of classes I recommend. It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to
    ensure it doesn't conflict with the classes in your cohort, the system won't show a time conflict.
  - On Monday morning after registration, a **HOLD** will be placed on your account to enable us to register you for the rest of your Fall 2013 courses. Therefore, you MUST register before that time in order to select your set/group (and, if you have already taken statistics, to select your final course).





## Registration for Fall 2013: EXCEPTIONS

- VARSITY ATHLETES: You will be registered for a set/group of classes that does not conflict with your athletic obligations; you do not need to register yourself for the cohort classes. You will be put into this cohort by the time it is your registration date.
  - You will register yourself for the class that is your choice.





### Registration for Fall 2013: YOUR CHOICE CLASS

• Statistics (ECON 2140) – You MUST take this if you haven't already by Fall 2013

If you have already taken ECON 2140, you can take:

- Statistical Decision Making (ECON/MGBU 2142)
- Foreign Language
- Math for Business: Calculus or Finite Math (if you were in Pre-Calc FR year)

You may not take anything else without my prior permission. You must register for this class prior to April hold date (Monday after registration).

More information about how to register for this class will be provided in March.



#### Registration Holds

- Do not forget to check your account in late March and early April to ensure there is no hold on your account preventing registration. If you find a hold, please clear it by registration!
- If you do not have a hold, but do not register for classes by the Monday after registration, you may not be able to select your set/group.
