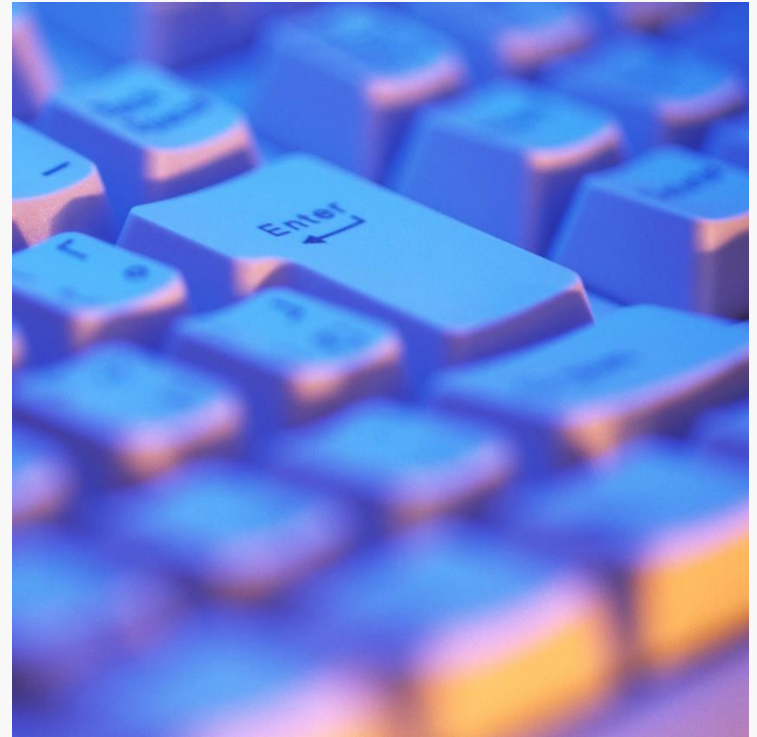

Final Grades & Calculating GPA



- University Grading System

A=4.0=93-100

A-=3.67=90-92

B+=3.33=87-89

B=3.0=83-86

B-=2.67=80-82

C+=2.33=77-79

C=2.0=73-76

C-=1.67=70-72

D=1.0=60-70

F=0.0=<59

- A passing grade is a D or better.

- At GSB only; classes at other institutions require C or better.

- “WF”, or withdrawal failure, is the numerical equivalent of an F and is counted towards GPA hours.

- $GPA = \text{Quality Points} / \text{Hours}$
- $43.68 / 16 = 2.73$

- Standards applied at the end of each semester, not for Midterm Progress Reports.
- **Grade requirements are often higher for retaining scholarships and other types of aid; contact the Financial Aid Office (Thebaud Hall, financialaid@fordham.edu, 718-817-3800) with any questions.**
- Academic Probation
 - Academic probation is a serious warning that a student must improve his/her academic performance.
 - May continue to study at Fordham & be awarded financial aid.
 - Not automatically acquired by the student but must be granted by the dean; restricted to two consecutive semesters.
 - Subject to dismissal if judged not to be making satisfactory progress.
 - May be prohibited from participating in extracurricular activities, being an RA, or representing the University in intervarsity athletic competition.
- Academic Suspension
 - In addition to GPA, a student who has three failures in any semester may be subject to suspension or dismissal.
 - Enforced termination of formal studies; only granted once in career for minimum of 2 semesters.
 - If after a period of suspension a student wished to continue his/her studies in the Gabelli School, he/she must formally apply for readmission. Need a 2.750 GPA at an approved baccalaureate institution.
- Academic Dismissal
 - Once dismissed, may no longer take courses.

Tutoring



• **GSB STUDY CENTER: BUSINESS**

- Tutoring is provided for Math, Economics, and many other Business courses Monday-Thursday 9am-7pm and Friday 9am-5pm in 207 Hughes Hall. Sign-up on Gabelli Access.

• **THE WRITING CENTER**

- Tutors address logical, rhetorical, and grammatical concerns in your writing. The Writing Center can assist with any type of writing, from conception, to composition, to completion. Who MUST take summer courses?



- Must fulfill following requirements prior to sophomore core curriculum in fall:
 - Ground Floor
 - Composition II
 - ✦ Exception: assigned ESL or Comp I by IALC for Spring 2014 are strongly recommended, but not required, to take in Summer
 - ✦ If you do not take in summer, MUST TAKE Spring 2015
 - Macroeconomics
 - Microeconomics
 - Math for Business: Finite
 - ✦ Exception: assigned Pre-Calculus for Fall 2013 are strongly recommended, but not required, to take Calc/Finite in Summer
 - ✦ If you do not take in summer, MUST TAKE Spring 2015
 - Math for Business: Calculus
 - ✦ Exception: assigned Pre-Calculus for Fall 2013 are strongly recommended, but not required, to take Calc/Finite in Summer
 - ✦ If you do not take in summer, MUST TAKE Spring 2015
 - Statistics I (ECON 2140)

Summer Courses at other Schools



- Find a class at a four year college or university. No community college classes or online classes will be accepted.
- Ensure the class meets for at least 37.5 total hours (be sure to account for holidays, etc.).
- Check that it is a class that is offered at Fordham University; you will only get credit for a class that would be also taught at Fordham.
- Print out the information for the class from the official website. This information should include:
 - Course description
 - Course meeting days/times
 - Term dates of course
 - Proof it is offered at a four year college or university
- Bring this information to a meeting with me (schedule on www.gsb-access.com) for my review.
- If I approve the course, bring the information to the relevant academic department for their approval.
- If they also approve the course, bring the signed approval form with the other course information and leave in my mailbox on the 4th floor of Hughes Hall.
- Register for the course.
- Pass the course with a grade of C or better.
- Send the academic transcript to the GSB Sophomore Dean, Hanaa Fawzy. The credits will be posted on your academic transcript and the grade will be listed, but not factored into your GPA.
