Courses in business law and business ethics are key to success in the working world.

This is why every Gabelli School student takes a core-curriculum course in each: Legal Framework of Business and Business Ethics.

In the law class, students learn the fundamental rules that govern doing business in the United States—and find out how to apply them in a shifting business landscape. They gain a foundation in contracts, and they learn the differences among types of business organizations: corporations, partnerships, limited liability companies, and agencies.

In the ethics course, students explore the issues that affect the stakeholders in a business relationship, debating what constitutes good or bad conduct. They also consider a question that is central to business education at Fordham: Should a business exist purely for the purpose of profit, or should it contribute to society in a greater way?

Students emerge with a sophisticated view of how legal and ethical issues affect business. Those who focus in this area are prepared for jobs in growth areas such as corporate compliance or for application to law school.

SUCCESS STORY

Zach Perron, Duke University School of Law

Zach Perron's path to the Duke University School of Law led through Fordham's freshman business course, The Ground Floor.

In his first year at the Gabelli School, Zach attended a business-law-related Ground Floor lecture that confirmed his early interest in a legal career. Taking the Legal Framework of Business course with Professor Dennis Cappello was a natural next step.
